Indiana State Fair

In 1851, the Indiana General Assembly passed an act “to encourage agriculture,” which also included the formation of a State Board of Agriculture. The primary goal of the Board was to create the first Indiana State Fair. In 1852, Indiana became the sixth state to begin holding a state agricultural fair. The State Fair has been located in Indianapolis for the majority of its 145-year existence, but other Indiana cities hosted the event in the 1800s. The State Fair takes place in August every summer.

Indiana Grain Buyers and Warehouse Licensing Agency

The mission of the Indiana Grain Buyers and Warehouse Licensing Agency (IGBWLA) is to reduce risk to grain producers. The agency has oversight of nearly 280 licensees. This includes over 470 facilities with a more than 521-million bushel storage capacity. The IGBWLA provides four license types: grain bank, warehouse, grain buyer and buyer/warehouse. Licenses, as well as bin charts and diagrams, are to be posted in a conspicuous place at each facility.
